Disaster Recovery Continues



In the Fall of 2017, our employees worked hard for several months to help many seniors recover from the damages of Hurricane Irma. We discovered months later, that there were still seniors who needed assistance with recovery.

Meet Ms. M. During Hurricane Irma, Ms.M., a widow caring for her adult disabled daughter, she experienced damage to both her fence and porch roof. The fence was torn away, while the porch roof started leaking. She also lost all her food due to an electricity outage. Tapping into Disaster Recovery Funds, her fence was fixed and peace of mind was restored. Also, Ms. M. was referred to The Small Business Administration (SBA) where she received a loan which was able to cover the roof repairs, along with food cards to cover grocery needs for her and her daughter. Ms. M. is very thankful for our help in restoring her yard and fence.

Outreach, Healthy Living and Senior Dental Needs



ElderSource was recently awarded multiple grants to support various programs and services. We are grateful to receive the funding that allows us to continue serving seniors, caregivers and adults with disabilities throughout our seven county area.

MaRCy and Outreach - For the fourth year, the National Council on Aging (NCOA) has awarded a

grant enabling ElderSource to continue its efforts to enroll seniors in benefits program for which they may be eligible. Using the Mobile Resource Center (MaRCy) – a mobile office on wheels – as a tool to increase awareness of ElderSource programs and resources, the outreach effort is designed to help low-income people with Medicare access programs that pay for healthcare, food, and more. Last year, ElderSource participated in more than 200 outreach events – health fairs, expos and community presentations, reaching more than 20,000 people giving them information about how to access important resources to stay healthy and live independently.

Healthy Eating for Successful Living - ElderSource Institute received grant support from the Grace H. Osborn Endowment at the Community Foundation for Northeast Florida, to deliver Healthy Eating for Successful Living workshops to older adults throughout Duval County. Healthy Eating is a six week nutrition

program which actively engages individuals in their own well-being and nutritional health, giving them the proper tools and knowledge to prevent, reduce, or manage nutritional health related aging issues. With the grant support ElderSource Institute will also provide over 2,500 nutritious, prepackaged, nonperishable meals to older adults who participate in the Healthy Eating program. Looking ahead into the new year, ElderSource Institute will continue to expand the Healthy Eating program as well as bring on an additional evidence based program focused on supporting caregivers.

United Way Dental Grant - ElderSource received a grant from the United Way of Northeast Florida to assist seniors needing dental care. ElderSource will coordinate with Provider Agencies to identify seniors seeking critical dental care they cannot afford.

We are excited to announce that ElderSource is the first business to become LGBT Elder Friendly through the training being offered by ElderSource Institute. Jacksonville Area Community Assessment Project Session

Join us for an upcoming session at ElderSource as part of our inclusive efforts for LGBT Seniors. We have partnered with The Jacksonville-Area Community Assessment Project, that aims to help people learn more about the local LGBT community and is funded through The Community Foundation. The project is part of a research study approved by the Institutional Review Board at UCLA. "Obtaining a comprehensive look at the LGBT community in Jacksonville is a critical part of figuring out how we can make our community better and more welcoming,



and fills a big gap as this data has not been collected before," said Michael Meyers, president of the LGBT Community Fund.

Aggregated, anonymous findings from this study are intended to help inform local service organizations, policy-makers, and residents about the diverse experiences and needs of the community.
